Progressive times have been added to our scorecards. For those playing for the "B" tee times, add 8 minutes to those times to check your pace of play. The MGA Board has asked the rangers to aggressively monitor this during our events.

Gene Dumont updated the membership on upcoming events. Check the newsletter for official sign up requirements and whether sign up is in the Pro Shop or on Chelsea.

The "error" in the proximity measuring tape and has been adjusted to accommodate our "closest to the pin" play going forward. We discovered that the tape was not in inches per foot but **tenth** of inches per foot Green tipped stakes are present to offer traffic control around sensitive areas of the golf course, Please DO NO drive carts into those areas.

Be advised, that with fairness in mind, the weekly flight payouts are determined to accommodate 30% of the field. Weekly participation and the event itself will drive the number positions paid out.

It was reported that the golf course saw 5700 rounds of golf in October. One thousand of these were outside play. We all must work to keep the course in as good of shape as possible. The 50/50 drawing was held. A \$70 and \$30 award was presented to the two winners, Bill Harville and Gary Pasche respectively.
